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Is the Fellowship Being Served?

The RCA WSO and Board's primary purpose is to serve the fellowship. A few (but not all) examples of how this is done is by: A) Publishing the RCA Blue Book and Recovery topic-oriented pamphlets, B) Strengthening current RCA groups, as well as encouraging the growth of regional retreats and new groups worldwide, C) Outreach as in Public Relations, Treatment Center Liaison, and *Hand In Hand*, D) Overseeing the Annual National RCA Conventions, and E) Handling RCA legal/structural matters and keeping bylaws current.

How does all this work get accomplished? We currently have two part-time staff at the WSO; all RCA can afford is a part-time staff. The reality is that the amount of work needing to be done at WSO would require two and a half full-time people.

That brings us back to the point of this article, *how is the work for the fellowship been done?* Traditionally the RCA Board has stepped up to fill this slot. But we are only nine couples; we can only do so much. After board service, sponsoring other couples, and attending to home and office, there is little time or energy left over. What this means is that while some RCA work IS getting done, much is not, simply because there are not enough able bodies to help out. RCA is also very limited financially. So how do we solve our problems? In other 12 Step programs such as AA, SAA and Al-Anon these problems were solved only when their Fellowships got actively involved in the process. In RCA we now stand at that same crossroads.

The other 12-Step Programs adopted what is called a General Service Conference Structure. In RCA a suggested plan would be:


RCA EXAMPLE: Each group has a General Service Representative (GSR) couple, representing them at the regional level. For example, the Manassas Group elects a GSR couple to the Southeast Region GSR meeting. There are nine RCA regions worldwide. Please look at the map and see what RCA Region you are part of (Canada has now been combined into one region).

These nine GSR district meetings would deal with all business within their region, such as: starting new RCA groups, holding an annual RCA regional retreat, opening a regional intergroup office to handle RCA support/meeting calls/emails/business in their region, and finally, and very importantly, *electing one delegate couple from each of their regions to serve on each National RCA Committee* (such as Literature, Structure, Communications, Convention, etc.), *as well as electing ONE couple to represent their region on the RCA Board of Trustees.*

Currently RCA has what are called Regional Liaison Couples (one couple per region) who have kindly offered to help out. But again, the task facing these couples is overwhelming, there's just too much to do. What has become clear to many people is that RCA needs a General Service Conference Structure if we are ever going to effectively serve our fellowship.

With you, the fellowship, directly involved and pitching in, much of the work would get done. In the process our RCA groups would be unified into nine cohesive regions, working together on regional business matters and enjoying their own unique regional fellowship.

We are asking you, the fellowship, to consider adapting a RCA General Service Conference Structure in the fall of 2003 as outlined above.



This graphic shows the nine proposed regions.

The transition would take place over a two-year period and be fully in place by the fall of 2005.

Over the next year we will be publishing a series of articles and fliers on this topic. We are asking for as much feedback and suggestions from you as possible, so that when we put this to you, the fellowship, for a vote at the annual 2003 convention, everyone wanting to give input will have had a chance to be heard. You can send us a letter or email us at the RCA website. Please title your note: General Service Conference Structure, so that it can be routed to the right place. Wishing all the best for you and your home groups.

Service Needs of Your Group?

What are your group's service needs from RCA's World Service Office? (The Central Office and the Board of Trustees)

This was a major topic at the New Orleans Board meeting attended by eight couples.

One approach was via the Board's taking its own service inventory. Under "What Is The Primary Purpose of the RCA Board?" there were several views:

- To serve the RCA Fellowship
- To carry the RCA message
- Unity
- To find HP's will for RCA and help put it into effect
- To provide leadership and structure

Another approach was group discussion along with RCA's in-attendance Central Office Manager. Board members asked what were the Manager's needs from the Board, so the Board could maintain a positive relationship with the Office Manager.

Various comments were:

- that the Office is a clearinghouse to the Fellowship and its member groups and couples
- that local (Northern California) Office Oversight Committee members should have monthly face-to-face check-ins with the Office
- that the Board needs to concentrate on and work with the Office
- "That's the lifeline. That's where it all starts from."

Board Committees also sought to identify group needs:

- more regional retreats

- a service structure whereby groups in each Region would elect a Board couple
- RCA audiotapes
- support for couples new to the RCA Board of Trustees each year
- an Outreach letter that groups could use with local churches & couples counselors
- additions to the RCA web site

Of course *Hand In Hand* was for many months a key request from groups, and Board members were relieved and grateful for the recent resumption of quarterly publication.

Finally, here are some group/Fellowship needs that have been aired which the Board and Office can't do alone. These need support from your Home Group and your own coupleship if they're to become available to our entire Fellowship:

- an active and extensive list of couples willing to serve as long-distance Couples Sponsors (by phone; by e-mail?)
- convention-savvy or retreat-experienced RCA-ers willing to help local groups and /or the Board put on each year's RCA International Convention
- active volunteers (local and remote) to support the Oakland Central Office with specific service tasks — data entry, literature fulfillment, tax returns, constant updates and additions to the Meeting Directory

WSO Office Manager's Report

The following report reflects the time frame of April 1 through April 30, 2002.

During this month, I put in 120 hours (including time spent at the Board meeting in New Orleans), Bob F logged in 26 hours as E-mail Consultant, and Barrett Johnson put in the equivalent of 20 hours as Consultant to the WSO Office Manager. That comes in at 166 hours for the month of April, which is within the contract range of 175-hrs/ month.

Contacts

The Office received 35 telephone contacts, and 430 e-mail contacts during April. I realize they are not broken down by region. I am looking at a system of recording contacts by region.

Literature/Tape Orders

The Office received and processed 34 literature orders, and 1 tape order. 17 of the literature orders came through PayPal from our website. The sales items are in the attached Sales Item Summary. Four Meeting Starter Packets were sold.

Donations

The Office received and processed 25 group donations, and 6 individual donations. One of the donations came through PayPal. I received two requests to adjust donation amounts from groups listed in the latest *Hand in Hand*. Four donations totaling \$77.00 came in response to the Appeal letter.

Office Oversight Committee

The first conference call meeting of the Office Oversight Committee took place, with another scheduled for May. I feel we got off to a very good start. I will leave the report of this meeting to the OOC Chair.

Hand in Hand

The *Hand in Hand* was mailed out the first week in April to 714 members. An additional 150 were printed and sent to the Office for using in Meeting Starter Packets, and requests from members not on the mailing list. 50 of the copies went to Bob F.

Thanks to Paul B. in St. Louis for doing a great job handling the bulk mailing. The total cost of the mailing was \$727.30. We have a balance of \$87.56 in our Bulk Mail account. To date I have received 44 returns from the Post Office.

Volunteers

Two volunteers helped out during April. One put in approximately 12 hrs of data entry work. The other finished up designing and making signs for the WSO Office doors (they look really nice).

Conclusion

The Board meeting was the focus of April. All other matters took a back seat to preparing for, and attending the meeting in New Orleans. The post meeting time has been spent catching up on other office matters, daily operations, and preparing the end of the month reports.

I was able to make some progress in identifying which meetings are still in need of GCC mailing labels. I will make following up on this a priority during May.

Scott S, in LA, was able to help me transfer the e-mail desired addresses from the database to my Outlook Express address book. They now need to be edited, and organized into a group that can be used for *Hand in Hand* mailings.

The US Postal Service is planning a rate hike in the next couple of months. I have not been able to get the new rate schedule from them yet, as applies to Priority mail, and their Printed Material, and Media rates. I will adjust the Shipping and Handling charges accordingly.

Message of Hope from an RCA Member

Enclosed is an article, actually an excerpt from my diary. My husband and I were active in an RCA group for several years before his death, one year ago today. His passing was sudden and unexpected. The excerpt speaks for itself, and was written a few months after his death.

Thank you for passing this on to other RCA couples.

Still in recovery, Margie

I went to our RCA meeting last Friday night. Actually I called the meeting. I asked for an open format, discussion style. It was unbelievably painful, yet unbelievably healing in a very powerful way. I wish you could have seen it somehow. The power of recovery groups, especially RCA, is amazing to me.

Cindy and David, Mark and Denise, Scott and Laura were there. Each one, in their own way talked about how our coupleship helped their coupleship. How it was obvious that we loved each other and had a core of warm friendship at the center of our relationship, despite our problems. How this gave them a goal to work toward in their own marriage, as they had such poor role models in the past.

I cried on and off throughout the meeting. It was a very emotional meeting. I shared how much you and I appreciated the meetings and them, as it truly helped us achieve a level the past two years that had special meaning to both of us.

Also, that if we had not come to that level, and you had died as we were two or three years ago, it would have been a very different experience for me grief-wise because of all the unresolved issues and anger/resentment between us.

I told them about our struggles this previous fall, beginning with my asking you to exchange written amends with me, as an RCA step eight. I shared how I waited a long time before deciding what to do about the fact that you did not get back to me about this, even with gentle reminders. And how this triggered my disease, and this all escalated to a pretty bad point for us. Then, you did do the amends, and we did exchange them, and they were beautiful.

Had I continued to try to figure out the healthy way to let go of this request, I would have never received the written amends that I have now, that allow me to put that part of our relationship to rest.

I think you realized how I could not continue without this concrete demonstration that you were really working the steps, in addition to needing closure on our hurts of the past.

There were a few chuckles from the other members as they pictured our “dance” unfold, and of course David said he’d have to think all the way home tonight about how to get out of doing a similar step with Cindy.

But, they all saw the value of the step we took together, and may have taken some kind of inventory about how none of us ever really knows how much time we will have to do the things we need to do.

Scott talked about how your death made him appreciate living in the present more, and being present. Laura told how she sees my recovery as being very solid, both before and after your death.

David told me I’m a very brave person for calling the meeting, and dealing with the pain in order to get some closure and healing on this chapter of our lives together.

I talked about how hard it is to go through your belongings because I feel like I am invading your privacy, and that it feels like I am acting out on my bottom line. I talked about how I wanted to protect your reputation and image among those non-recovering people you knew (work, family, etc.) by screening your stuff before they got to see it, but I didn’t have the strength to do it all.

I talked about how I have been humbled and have allowed many people to help me, something that would have been hard for me to do before your death, but something I am working on in recovery.

I talked about my struggles with my HP now, my anger and bewilderment with my HP, and how the serenity prayer got me through many days.

Mark spoke of how he felt a great loss when he heard you died, and his grief seemed disproportionate to his actual relationship with you. So, he had to take another look at that. He also shared that he felt like we should pull up another chair for you. Denise cried most of the meeting and was not able to share, verbally, but I knew.

The meeting ended with Kathy’s Prayer, and some much-needed hugs. I believe the meeting is dissolving now because of many different factors. That is very sad, but up to my HP to deal with.

I cried all the way home, until my head hurt so bad it felt like it was going to split open. I was exhausted. And I came out of the meeting with a feeling I have had so strongly since you died, so many times.

I wish you knew how many lives you impacted in really positive and wonderful ways, how many people looked up to you. It would have changed your feelings about yourself, I am sure.

I will always love you and I will always feel married to you.

PS I did get permission to submit the article to Hand In Hand from all the members of our group. The names have been changed.

<p style="text-align: center;">Letting Go</p> <p>by Carl S. in recovery with JoAnn</p> <p>Before we found recovery, we tried to control events and people around us as best we could. We would only be happy if things went our way-the right way.</p> <p>We had to control the future so we could be ok when we got there. How much needless expenditure of time and effort went into trying to control! Then, there was the most effective way of dealing with any subject—worrying about it.</p> <p>Recovery, particularly the Third Step, brought about an idea that seemed impossible at that time. The secret to being ok was not in controlling what was going to happen or be, but to take care of ourselves so we could be ok regardless of what was to happen or was to be! What a radical idea that was! Even if it were true, how do we take care of ourselves that well?</p> <p>We have found that keeping from being Hungry, Angry, Lonely, or Tired (HALT) keeps us out of a lot of misery. Regular attendance at our RCA group is a big help. Having a sponsor couple and sponsoring other couples keeps our focus. Reading our RCA literature keeps us in contact with proven guidelines. Service work gets us out of ourselves.</p> <p>If we are doing all these things, we find we are ok as the future rolls around.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Truth</p> <p>by Carl S. in recovery with JoAnn</p> <p>Before we found recovery, we both had a problem with the truth-I had trouble telling the truth and my partner had trouble believing the truth. Since my primary relationship was with my addiction, it was easy to justify not telling the truth. I could always find a reason why I could say this or claim that and believe I was being truthful, or that I was justified in not telling the truth. My partner was obsessed with my behavior as a reason why partner was not happy. So, partner could believe I was not telling the truth all the time and blame me all the time.</p> <p>When we found recovery, we found it was necessary to be truthful to be in recovery. With evidence of recovery in our partner and some peace in ourselves, we found it was much easier to believe partner. We also found truth to be an elusive concept. Is not telling something being truthful? If I tell something as I remember it but which is not exactly factual being truthful?</p> <p>With recovery, we have learned some balance. I probably need to tell my partner about things that will affect partner but not things that will not or things from the past that would only hurt partner. My partner does not need to blame me as a source of distress. As a couple, we have learned to give credit for doing the best we can.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Self-Responsibility</p> <p>by Carl S. in recovery with JoAnn</p> <p>Being obsessed with our partner’s behavior was common before recovery. I was ok but my partner drove me nuts. If she only had a better job and made more money. If he only would keep house better. If we only had more/less sex. If partner were not so demanding. If, If, If, If. These were the obstacles to being happy.</p> <p>Recovery brought the surprising idea we were responsible for our own happiness. Our partner could not “make us mad”, or upset, or unhappy, unless we allowed it. If we worked a good individual program, we could be ok regardless of what our partner did. We needed to stay away from thoughts of how we did not have the right house, in-laws, income, or children. We needed to think more of how we can contribute to our partner, children, in-laws, job, and RCA group. The more our thinking was outwardly directed to our HP and people around us, and less on ourselves, the better we were.</p> <p>Now that we are well into the recovery process, we still get upset at some things about our partner and our couples relationship with HP and the world. However, we have learned the only person or couple we have control over is us. So, we work on what we can control and things get better quickly. Circumstances do not change necessarily, but we change.</p>
